The post holder should also have excellent communication and proven leadership skills. Priority will be given to senior academic level applicants (i.e. Associate Professor/ Reader or Professor), although Senior Lecturers with excellent qualifications will also be considered. Academic rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Preferred start date is August 2019 or as soon as possible thereafter.
